MID YEAR ENROLMENTS

We are currently finalising our Mid-Year enrolments. If you are aware of any families who may be considering enrolling mid-year at St Joseph's, please ask them to contact the school asap.

The Specifics: Our school has TWO intakes into Reception each year (Term 1 and Term 3).

The relevant dates for new Receptions:

- If your child turns 5 on or before the 30th April they can start school in Term 1 of that year.
- If you child turns 5 on or before 31 October they can start school in Term 3 of that year.
- Children starting in Reception in Term 3 will have a minimum of 6 terms in Reception.
- Children whose birthday falls between 1 November and 31 December are not eligible to commence school before the following year.
