BOOK WEEK

As you all know, this week is Book Week—a time that can be a bit stressful for parents as you search for the perfect costume for your child for the annual Book Week Parade.

When it comes to dressing up, I must say I'm always impressed by the high standard of costumes here at St. Joseph's, and by high standards, I don't mean expensive, I mean creative. The children always look fantastic and truly enjoy the event, so parents, you deserve a big round of applause!

However, in the midst of all the costume excitement, it's easy to forget the real purpose of Book Week. This week serves as a wonderful reminder of the importance of reading, and that goes for everyone, not just children. It's crucial for parents and the school to work together to foster a love of reading in our children. Taking the time to read with or to your child can be an incredibly rewarding experience.

An initiative we introduced a few years back is our reading logs. The idea of these is to encourage all children to read consistently and take responsibility for keeping a record of it. Our recent assessment data shows that our school wide reading 'scores' have increased since we introduced these (along with other good quality teaching). If you have any questions about how to make reading enjoyable for your child, please don't hesitate to reach out to their teacher.

NAPLAN RESULTS

All schools have received their most recent NAPLAN results. As a staff we have spent time analysing ours. Our teachers in all grades analyse these because even though it is only the Yr 3 and 5 students that participate in them, they are a reflection on all learning that the child has done up until the year of the test. Some years we have small cohorts participating which can skew our overall data and make it tricky for comparisons, this year however we had good numbers in the Yr 3 & 5 cohorts so it made comparing a worthwhile experience. Overall we were very happy with our results. I have included a table below that compares our results to: 1. All schools in the Port Pirie Diocese (this includes many small country schools like ours), 2. All Catholic schools in South Australia and 3. The National average (all schools in Australia). As you will see our results are higher in most areas in the comparisons. We continue to look for where we can improve but at the same time, what we need to continue to do well.
